What You'd Do

As Chair of the County Appointments Advisory Committee (AAC), you'll spend some time recruiting a diverse group of members to the AAC, ensuring that they are trained and supported in their role.

You'll use data from our membership system to ensure that the appointments process is working in a timely and effective manner, identifying and addressing any delays. You'll also work with members of the AAC to make sure that the process is supportive and welcoming for our new appointees.

From time-to-time you'll attend ACC panel meetings but you don't need to attend them all. You'll also chair the occasional meeting of the full AAC.

There will be times when you'll work closely and confidentially with the County Commissioner to consider adverse references or adverse confidential enquiries and to deal with membership suspensions or disagreements regarding the appointments process, enlisting the support of other AAC panel members if required.
