What badges could I work towards?

- Choose three of these activities to do:
- a. Report on a local event, either past or present. It could be written for something like a newsletter or recorded so people can listen to it.
 - b. Make contact with another Pack. Send them videos, letters or emails for whatever length of time your leader suggests.
 - c. Find out how people with a visual or hearing impairment communicate. You might learn about Braille, Makaton or British Sign Language. Learn a simple phrase in one of the ways you have learned.
 - d. Tell a story about an experience you've shared with your leaders and other Cubs. Make sure that you communicate clearly and that everyone is following the story.
 - e. Hold a simple conversation in another language.
 - f. Write three simple messages using codes, ciphers, invisible ink or semaphore. Try to work out three similar messages given to you.
 - g. Get an adult or Young Leader to give you a message. Remember it and repeat it back to them 10 minutes later.
 - h. Pass a message to someone using amateur radio.
 - i. Take part in Jamboree On The Air (JOTA) or Jamboree On The Internet (JOTI).



International:
