When

Where

Gdańsk (Sobieszewo Island), Poland.

Sobieszewo is a unique district of the city of Gdańsk, Sobieszewo Island is an area of about 35 km² with more than 1000 ha of woods. The beach, 11 km long, is the longest one in Gdańsk and includes two guarded bathing areas.

On the Island there are two nature reserves: Ptasi Raj (Birds' Paradise) on the western end of Śmiała Wisła and Mewia Łacha (Seagull Dune) on the East, near Przekop Wisły.

As an act of recognition of Sobieszewo Island's natural beauty and unique value, the area has been granted the status of a legally protected nature park.

We also plan on spending a few days in Krakow at the end of the Jamboree to learn more about Polands History.

Cost

This is always the important question, and the honest answer is we do not know! The leadership team have decided on a top price of £1500, although this depends on the unit itself.

In keeping with the UK Youth Shape values, and because of the flexibility of the Jamboree, key decisions are going to be made by the unit – such as what attractions we visit in Krakow after the Jamboree – the decision will be yours!

Whatever the cost though, there will be fundraising options available – making this the most accessible Jamboree ever!

Selection process

Every County in the UK has been given 36 places to form a unit. We are expecting this camp to be very popular, and a selection weekend is the fairest way to select the participants.

The selection weekend is a free weekend of activities, where we just want the participants to come and have fun. Eurojam in 2020 is open to 14-18 year olds, the selection weekend is open to all Scouts and Explorers born between 27/07/2002 and 27/07/2006.

The selection weekend will be held at Moorhouse Activity Centre on 16th February. Exact details will be available once the application process has ended.
